# Message

## FROM THE CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

### OVERVIEW

The BC Arts Council is firmly committed to supporting the arts and cultural community's outstanding contribution to the cultural, economic and social well-being of British Columbians. With significant support from the Province of British Columbia, Council focused throughout 2014/15 on its mission "to engage all British Columbians in a healthy arts and cultural community that is recognized for its excellence". The majority of support is provided to B.C. artists and organizations engaged in the fields of media arts, dance, publishing, literary arts, creative writing, theatre, music, museums, community arts, visual arts and arts training.

The Honourable Coralee Oakes, Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development, continued to provide strong guidance and support through frequent communications with Council. Her Ministry awarded \$24 Million in grants in 2014/15, a consistent year-over-year level of support. The funding includes resources from the BC Creative Futures initiative, which supports youth engagement and early career development opportunities throughout the province, introduced in 2013 to develop the creative workforce.

### PEER REVIEW

In 2014/15, Council reviewed a record breaking 2,770 grants using its established peer review process. Engaging 162 artists from across B.C., our advisory committees and juries selected 1,373 recipients from a wide range of applications, submitted by individual artists, collectives and organizations. Each proposal is assessed against published criteria which guide the peer review process and are informed by the Council's strategic plan.

## PROGRAM REVIEW

During 2014/15, Council undertook the most extensive review in its history of the full suite of operating assistance programs, combined with a review of two special programs: *Innovations* and *Capacity and Sustainability*. Consultations were held in 12 communities across B.C. leading to the introduction of a new streamlined application process for operating assistance. Further new initiatives will be rolled out during the 2015/16 fiscal year.

## STRATEGIC PLAN

Council launched a new Strategic Plan in 2014, which rests on the strong belief that a thriving arts and cultural community contributes not only to a healthy civil society, but also to economic growth, stronger communities and job creation. Once again, artistic excellence and community engagement feature prominently in the Strategic Plan. The plan also commits to a broader understanding of the critical importance of the province's Aboriginal artists and of the diversity of B.C.'s cultural identity. Building more resources for the arts and cultural community is the fourth and final strategic goal.

## CORE VALUES

The vision and goals of the BC Arts Council were further refined in the process of renewing the Strategic Plan. These are guided by the following overarching six core values:

### ARTISTIC EXCELLENCE

Foster the development and support the achievements of individual artists and arts and cultural organizations, including those with diverse voices across diverse practices, throughout British Columbia.

### RECOGNITION

Acknowledge and promote the work of British Columbia's artists.

### ACCESS

Provide the opportunity for all British Columbians to actively engage and participate in the arts.

### ABORIGINAL ENGAGEMENT

Embrace Aboriginal culture and heritage and celebrate its ongoing connection to the lives of all British Columbians.

### CONSULTATION

Work collaboratively and creatively with artists and cultural communities throughout the province to develop new initiatives and improve existing programs.

### GOVERNANCE

Use fair and transparent processes that adhere to principles of accountability, independence, merit and equity.

## SUMMARY

B.C.'s artists deserve our collective thanks for playing a critical role in the overall development of the province's diverse communities. In addition, we acknowledge the community leaders who are committed to supporting and advancing the arts across British Columbia. # Observations

## THE ADJUDICATION PROCESS: OBSERVATIONS 2014/15

Summary of assessment provided by BC Arts Council advisors.

The BC Arts Council's appointed members, management and staff, along with its advisory committees and juries, are committed to providing excellent service to the artists, arts organizations and citizens of British Columbia. Central to the success of this service is the arts community's endorsement of the peer review process, which is fortified by the breadth and depth of sectoral knowledge that the members bring to the adjudication table.

In constructing the committees and juries, a balance is always sought amongst factors including the province's wide range of cultural practice, and its geographic and demographic diversity. Adjudication committee members are selected based on their specific experience from the Council's client base as well as from online nominations to the adjudicator database ([www.bcartscouncil.ca/adjudication/nominate.aspx](http://www.bcartscouncil.ca/adjudication/nominate.aspx)). This selection process ensures that Council has access to the widest possible spectrum of working artists and arts administrators.

Throughout 2014/15, the BC Arts Council was engaged in the largest program review in its history, with particular focus on Operating programs in all disciplines. As a result, the majority of Operating applicants submitted a short application form, outlining any major developments within the organization, and were not subject to the standard peer adjudication process in 2014/15.

In 2014/15, the Advisory Committees were consulted as part of Council's Operating program review to provide feedback on how existing Operating programs serve the sector. Advisors were asked the questions: *What should we keep doing?*, *What should we start doing?*, and *What should we stop doing?* From the responses to these three questions, the following broad themes emerged:

- Operating and project funding streams – *The relationship between project and operating support, in particular the organizational models and types of activity served by each.*
- Cultural policy – *Linking BC Arts Council programs and priorities to a broader cultural policy for the province.*
- “One Size Fits All” – *The need for appropriate nuance within program structures to serve a diversity of artists and disciplines.*
- Peer review – *The definition of ‘peer’ and the relationships, boundaries and possibilities within that definition.*
- Regionality (decentralization, connectivity, access) – *The regional reach of funding, the access of communities across the province to professional arts experiences and the challenges of establishing and maintaining a professional practice in rural, regional and urban communities.*
- Emerging organizational models – *Artists are organizing in various ways to support their creative activity.*
- Deadlines and funding cycles – *Impact on planning processes and artists’ ability to respond to opportunities.*
- Proliferation of funding programs – *An increase in programs and deadlines impacts applicants’ capacity.*
- Interdisciplinary activity – *The relevance of disciplinary silos in the contemporary arts ecology.*
- Overall ecology – *The breadth of activity in the sector.*
- Public and community engagement – *A discussion of engagement is current, relevant and important to the sector.*

These themes emerging from the Advisory consultations will have a significant impact on the final results of the program review. A full report will be available on the BC Arts Council website in 2015/16.

# Goals

## 2014/15 GOALS OVERVIEW

In 2014/15, the BC Arts Council began implementing strategies to support the 2014-2018 Strategic Plan. These actions will activate the policy and program priorities while striving to support the creative and innovative capacity of the arts and cultural community and represent the interests of the creative sector.

Council is firmly committed to supporting the artistic excellence of British Columbia's talented artists and important arts and cultural organizations that: encourage participation in artistic and creative activity; improve quality of life and social cohesion; develop, attract and retain skilled and innovative thinkers for the creative sector; foster community identity and a sense of place; and contribute to local, regional and provincial economies.

### GOAL ONE -

#### **FOSTER ARTISTIC EXCELLENCE IN ALL ART FORMS AND PRACTICES** **STRATEGIES**

1. Invest resources in artistic exploration and innovation.
2. Encourage a broad-based appreciation of the breadth and depth of artistic excellence in our province.
3. Strengthen the capacity of arts and cultural organizations and individual artists throughout the province to further their artistic achievement.
4. Support opportunities for skills training and participation in the creation, exhibition and performance of art.
5. Create opportunities for the next generation of artists.



## GOAL TWO -

### **STRENGTHEN ENGAGEMENT IN THE ARTS**

#### **STRATEGIES**

1. Increase opportunities for all British Columbians to participate in the arts.
2. Provide leadership to increase the vitality of community engagement.
3. Build awareness of the contribution that arts and culture make to British Columbians' quality of life.
4. Strengthen relationships and build partnerships with other sectors including health, education, tourism, social services, business, and governments.
5. Build youth engagement in the arts.

#### **STRATEGIES**

1. Give thanks for and acknowledge the contribution of Aboriginal artists and culture.
2. In consultation with the Aboriginal community, create opportunities for Aboriginal artists and arts and cultural organizations to participate in a full range of artistic and cultural activities.
3. Strengthen Aboriginal organizations' existing and developing connections across and within the broader cultural community.
4. Provide culturally appropriate support and financial assistance for Aboriginal artists and cultural organizations.

#### **STRATEGIES**

1. Advocate for stronger support for artists and arts and cultural organizations.
