MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As lead agency for arts and cultural funding and development for the province, the BC Arts Council continued to support and enhance artistic excellence and innovation throughout 2016/17.

Thanks to stable, year-over-year funding from the Government of British Columbia, Council was able to provide \$24 million in assistance to artists and key arts and culture organizations ensuring the sector remains an inspiring and vibrant force that enriches our lives and helps drive our economy.

Through the provision of adjudicated core financial support and one-time project assistance, artists and arts organizations continued to flourish in communities throughout B.C.

This year, in addition to providing support and expertise to clients and stakeholders, BC Arts Council introduced a new funding model, conducted important program reviews and further supported government priorities to grow the province's creative economy.

MINISTER AND APPOINTED MEMBERS

The Hon. Peter Fassbender, Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development during 2016/17, continued to provide thoughtful guidance and support to Council. He promoted the importance and value of the arts and culture sector as a major contributor to both the economy and to the development of healthy, vibrant communities.

The BC Arts Council also thanked outgoing member Jane Macdonald for her contribution and welcomed new members Susan Jackson and Yosef Wosk to help direct Council moving forward.

PEER REVIEW & GRANTS AWARDS

As a steward of public funds, Council relies on peer review to make informed and impartial decisions in the allocation of resources, to ensure freedom of thought and expression, and to engage in collective decision-making.

Council draws upon the expertise of British Columbia's arts and culture community to provide this independent peer-review adjudication process. In 2016/17, 171 artists, arts administrators, academics and other cultural professionals from across the province provided this essential work to ensure funding was distributed through a fair and neutrally-administered process.

In addition to reviewing applications, recommending successful grant recipients and providing insightful feedback to our clients, these advisors and jurors were instrumental in apprising the BC Arts Council about changing priorities, needs and challenges within the cultural sector. This vital information is a key component in ensuring Council remains responsive to sector needs so it can provide timely and knowledgeable policy development.

We are grateful for the wealth of talent found throughout the province and thank everyone who gave of their time and expertise to serve on a jury or panel over the past year. Together, they reviewed 2,935 applications, recommending funding for 1,402 recipients.

PROGRAM REVIEW & NEW FUNDING MODEL

The BC Arts Council announced a new program delivery model in May 2016. While individual programs and funding allocations remain unchanged, the organizational framework was revised to simplify the application process for clients and to better respond to the needs of the arts community.

The move to create a streamlined funding model was the result of an extensive program review which began in 2014 to explore ways of improving efficiencies, maximizing limited resources, and increasing effectiveness in program delivery.

In response to stakeholder feedback, the BC Arts Council created the following four funding streams:

- Professional Arts
- Community Arts
- Strategic Initiatives
- Partnerships

The most significant change implemented in 2016/17 was the creation of the Strategic Initiatives category that replaced several former special project programs such as Capacity & Sustainability and Innovations.

Another change initiated this year was the introduction of Enhanced Capacity support. Organizations receiving Operating Assistance are now able to apply for additional Enhanced Capacity funding concurrent with their extended cycle intake application. This funding is intended to help organizations build capacity and respond to strategic priorities, challenges and opportunities and will offer enhanced support for operations. It allows for increased flexibility while still providing stable, base operating support.

In addition, Council staff worked alongside First Peoples' Cultural Council to complete an extensive review of the Aboriginal Arts Development Awards, through a series of 10 regional community meetings held across the province. The results of the review will be available in 2017/18. As well, a comprehensive review of the Creative Futures program was initiated.

Moving forward, the BC Arts Council remains committed to continuing a process of review and building on the insights gained during consultations so that funding streams and programs continue to meet the needs of the province's arts and culture sector.

CREATIVE ECONOMY

The Government of British Columbia recognizes the importance of growing the creative economy and the BC Arts Council continues to actively pursue concrete actions towards that objective.

Launched in February 2016, the Province's three-year Creative Economy Strategy is helping cultivate this thriving sector. The strategy focuses on four key areas: leveraging talent and creative clusters; accessing new markets; maximizing investment; and enriching communities.

The BC Arts Council is pleased to participate in the development of initiatives that support this strategy, including raising the awareness of the cultural, social and economic impact of arts and culture, delivering grant programs to further the success of the creative sector, as well as focusing on training in business development and leveraging philanthropy and private sector support.

ABORIGINAL ENGAGEMENT

Council values the vibrant and significant contribution of Aboriginal artists to the cultural make up of B.C. and appreciates ongoing consultations with the Aboriginal community that strengthen connections, create opportunities, and explore ways to improve culturally-appropriate program delivery by identifying gaps and working together on a responsive approach to support Aboriginal arts practice.

With funding from the BC Arts Council, the First Peoples' Cultural Council supports the unique role of Aboriginal artists and communities throughout the province through the delivery of the Aboriginal Arts Development Awards and the Aboriginal Youth Engaged in the Arts programs.

In response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action report published in July 2015, Council staff initiated a series of branch meetings led by our Aboriginal Youth Intern to discuss the implications of the Calls to Action. Working with Council's Aboriginal Engagement Committee, a collective response to the TRC Calls to Action will remain a priority for the agency.

The BC Arts Council is committed to further strengthening Aboriginal engagement in the arts and we are well-placed to implement additional strategies to address barriers to access within Council's mainstream programs.

SUMMARY

The BC Arts Council feels privileged to work with such a breadth of talented artists, both established and emerging, as well as inspiring cultural and community leaders committed to supporting and advancing the arts in British Columbia.

We are proud of the work the BC Arts Council is doing to foster and evolve the arts in this province and to help showcase British Columbia's immense talent on world stages. We look forward to continuing our role in support of our vital arts and cultural community.

OBSERVATIONS

THE ADJUDICATION PROCESS: OBSERVATIONS 2016/17

The BC Arts Council draws upon the expertise of British Columbia's arts and culture community to provide an independent peer-review adjudication process to determine successful grant recipients. This process is highly regarded by the sector and is considered vital to ensure that the distribution of government funding remains fair and neutrally administered.

Through careful consideration of committee and jury composition, Council strives to reflect the province's wide range of cultural practices as well as its geographic and demographic diversity. Adjudication committee members are selected on their experience and expertise from both our client base and from submitted nominations. This selection process ensures Council has access to the widest possible spectrum of working artists and arts administrators. Information about submitting nominations for consideration can be found on [our website](#).

The adjudication process not only provides significant sectoral knowledge necessary to make informed funding decisions, but also creates an avenue for panel members to discuss trends and emerging issues affecting the sector and to apprise and advise Council of their findings.

Summary of points made by the discipline advisory committees during the 2016/17 year include:

Artistic Achievement

High calibre programming continues to be realized by British Columbia's established arts and cultural organizations. Recognizing the importance of artistic excellence as one of Council's primary funding considerations, adjudication panels across all creative disciplines praised the quality of applications offering risk-taking, innovative and creative approaches in fostering artistic achievement.

Community Engagement

Through consultation with artists, arts and cultural organizations and governments, the BC Arts Council continued its work to strengthen its engagement with the arts and culture community in 2016/17.

In addition, advisory panels found that, overall, organizations are continuing to find creative ways to gain new supporters and renew connections with established audiences. BC-based dance companies, including Indigenous artists, have gained additional audiences and recognition through touring initiatives provincially, nationally and internationally. Building on this success, advisory committees recommend similar touring programs be designed and implemented for visual arts, museums, media arts and literary arts organizations.

Indigenous representation in programming has improved, but is still lacking in artistic and organizational leadership. Additional actions are also needed across the sector to further goals of diversity, equity and inclusion, both culturally and geographically, as well as to decrease barriers identified by disabled individuals.

Organizational Capacity

Although facilities and capital projects remain a priority for many organizations, the development of partnerships and creation of collaborative spaces is better enabling expansion and renovation of existing facilities to accommodate increased programming and activities. Leadership training, succession planning, and developing strategic, forward-thinking visions remain as items to improve for the sector.

Funding levels, in particular for festivals and community arts councils, continue to be of concern, resulting in recommendations to continue reviews of BC Arts Council's models and formulas.

Overall, committee members recognized the significant contribution artists and arts and culture organizations continue to make to the provincial economy, to the health and vitality of B.C. communities, and to the enrichment of our lives.

Strategies

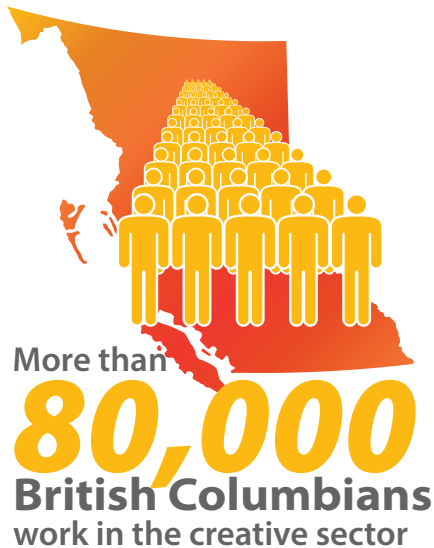
1. Give thanks for and acknowledge the contribution of Aboriginal artists and culture.

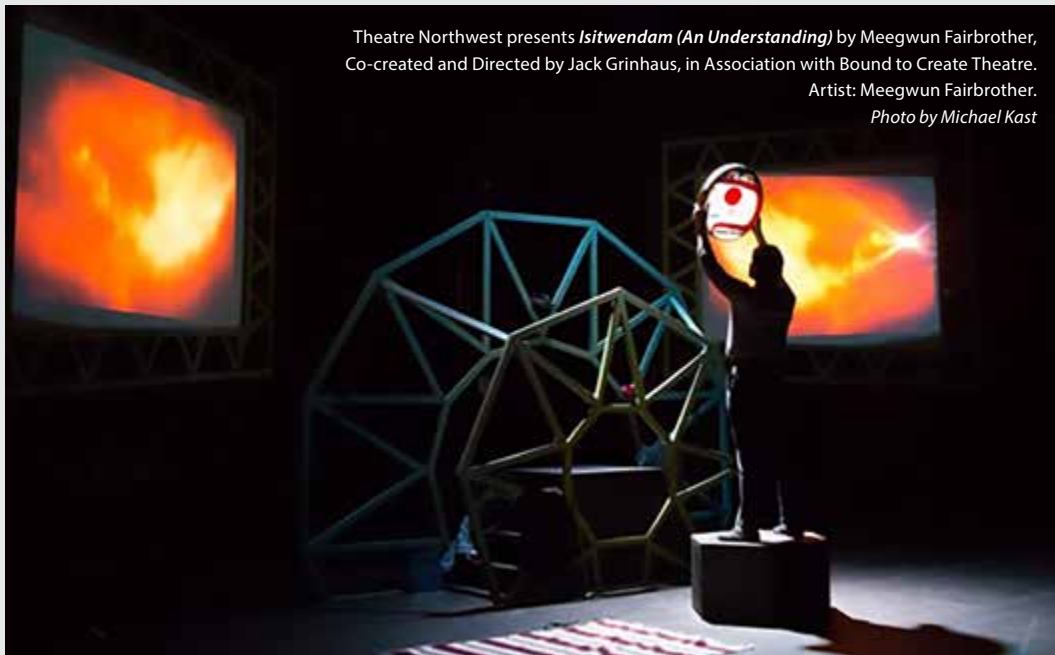

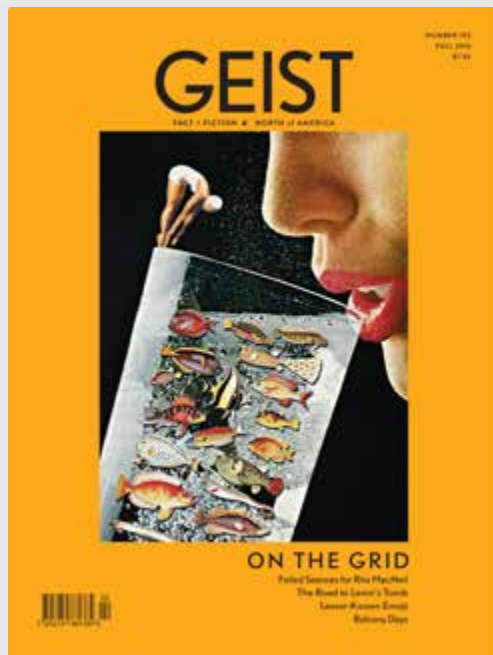
